

2010 General Assembly Update

Come and join us in Fredericton at the 2010 General Assembly of the RASC from July 1 - 4.

We are delighted that the 2010 RASC General Assembly has been awarded to the New Brunswick Centre of the RASC. The 2010 GA will be held in conjunction with the 10th Anniversary of the RASC New Brunswick Centre. This will be the first time the GA will be held in

the province of New Brunswick and at the site of Canada's oldest existing observatory - the Brydone Jack Observatory/Museum built in 1851.

There are three tours planned at this time. The first is a guided walking tour of the William Brydone Jack Observatory and other related, historical sites of interest on campus. The second is a bus tour to the Bay of Fundy to see the world's highest tides in action and walk on the ocean floor. Included will be a stop in Alma for lunch and a drive-through of Fundy National Park and future Dark-Sky Preserve. The third tour is a combined whale watching/sailing trip out of St. Andrews by the Sea. With lunch in St. Andrews and time in the famous Kingsbrae Gardens, this will be a day of adventure and sightseeing.

Accommodations, social events, and lectures will take place on the beautiful University of New Brunswick campus overlooking the city of Fredericton and the Saint John River. All major events/meals will have a choice of seafood or non-seafood fare. If you are a seafood fanatic, then you'll enjoy the chance to have mussels, clams, fish and chips, lobster rolls, Atlantic salmon, and lobster.

Speakers are still being finalized, and an open paper session will be held for RASC members. A poster display/contest as well as an astrophoto contest will be held... so bring your favorite images from the past year. The hospitality suite will be open nightly for after hours' socializing.

Attendees will be able to start booking room accommodations, directly through the University of New Brunswick, in mid-January. Room rates are \$32 + HST for a single room and \$24 per person for a double room. Information on contacts for this will be posted mid-January.

We also recommend that attendees consider their travel arrangements early. Fredericton Airport

is small and is only serviced by Air Canada and currently has 7 flights per day. Make your plans early to be sure you can get a flight in and out to suit your travel plans. We will be offering free pickup and delivery to and from the Airport to the University of New Brunswick.

More Historical Heritage Organized Online

Walter MacDonald is continuing to expand the historical depth of our free online offerings of RASC publications.

You can now find links to the "informal" JRASC off-print series on a single <u>web page</u> [5]. These papers were marketed as separate publications, particularly in the 1930s and 1940s, and are now quite rare. This mode of republication has made available, under a single set of covers, works originally issued serially, those which were deemed to be of special interest to RASC members, or those worthy of wider distribution beyond the RASC.

Among the off-prints are works such as **R.G. Haliburton**'s *New Materials for the History of Man-The Festival of the Dead;* **Peter M. Millman**'s *Meteor Photography;* and **Walter Haas**' *Does Anything Ever Happen on the Moon?*

Walter has also created a <u>web page</u> [6] devoted to **Helen Hogg**'s legendary *Out of Old Books*. Dr. Hogg privately printed about 25 hardbound copies of the collected series, one of which is in the Rare Book collection of the Archives. Now all RASC members and others can easily have their own electronic version of *Out of Old Books*. Honorary RASC member **Prof. Owen Gingerich** (Harvard University and the Smithsonian Astrophysical Observatory) has called *Out of Old Books* a "wonderful series," and others have likened it to the late **Dr. Joseph Ashbrook**'s <u>Astronomical</u> Scrapbook column from *Sky & Telescope*.

An alternative pre-existing site devoted to *Out of Old Books* is maintained by **Dr. Rob van Ghent** in <u>Utrecht</u> [7].




Scanning the Skies for Life; where it began, where else it exists and what it all means.
