### June's Sky At a Glance

We have a full Moon on the 2nd and a new Moon on the 16th. Mercury is well placed in the morning sky from the 9th to the 30th and Venus reaches greatest elongation on the 6th. Throughout June, Venus and Jupiter are in the western evening sky and reach minimum separation on June 30. Saturn is visible most of the night and is retrograding in Libra.

#### **RASC Board Acclamation Brings New Member**

The 2015 election for the RASC Board of Directors concluded on May 15 with three candidates acclaimed for the three open positions on the nine-member Board. One of the three, Heather Laird of the Calgary Centre, is a new member joining the Board for a three-year term.

Incumbent Board members James Edgar of the Regina Centre and Robyn Foret of the Calgary Centre were returned to the Board for three years. Paul Schumacher of the Victoria Centre is stepping down after serving two years on the Board.

Because there were only three candidates for the three open positions, all three candidates were acclaimed, and no vote will be required.

"I am delighted that Heather is joining the Board, and I look forward to the new energy and new perspective that she will bring to the Board," said RASC Second Vice-President Chris Gainor, who is chair of the Nominating Committee. "James and Robyn are working hard for the RASC, as we all know, and I'm glad to see them return to the Board."

He also thanked Schumacher for his work on the Board. "Paul helped the RASC make the transition from our old structure to the new setup, and he also played a key role in the success of the GA in Victoria last year. I'm very happy that Paul will stay involved in the RASC by joining the Nominating Committee."

Gainor noted that while there was a contest for Board positions in 2013, the last two Board elections have ended with acclamations. "I am gratified that we have very capable people coming forward to stand for the Board, but I and other members of the Board believe that we must work harder in the future to ensure that we have contested elections so that the full membership has a voice and a choice in the composition of the Board."

# Vancouver Centre announces the opening of the Trottier Observatory by Suzanna Nagy, RASC Vancouver Centre

Through a very generous donation of \$2.7 million by the Trottier Family Foundation (Lorne Trottier, Louise Trottier, and their daughters, Claire and Sylvia), Simon Fraser University (SFU) in Burnaby B.C. has completed construction of the Trottier Observatory. The Trottier Observatory features a six-metre-

diameter dome housing a 0.7-metre-aperture telescope on a fully robotic alt-azimuth mount built by PlaneWave Instruments.

On 2015 April 17, the Trottier Observatory was revealed to the public with a Gala Star Party hosted by SFU with the assistance of RASC Vancouver Centre and 2,000 people in attendance.

There is now a partnership between Simon Fraser University and the Vancouver Centre of the RASC. In exchange for RASC volunteers bringing their telescopes to star parties as well as staffing the Observatory for public events, SFU will share a percentage of the Observatory time for use by members of Vancouver Centre.

Vancouver Centre is thrilled to be an active partner in SFU's public outreach Observatory program. We are looking forward to many years of great star parties and other public events.

## **The Deer Lick Group**

This group of galaxies is believed to have been named by Tomm Lorenzin in honour of Deer Lick Gap in the mountains of North Carolina. The most prominent member is NGC 7331, at a distance of 46 million light-years. The LRGB image is a result of 28 hours over three nights taken with a 14-inch carbon-fibre astrograph on an ME mount. The camera was a modified U16m with Baader Filters.
