
Arizona Astronomy Tour scheduled for September 2016!

The University of Manitoba, University of Winnipeg, and Brandon University are hosting the annual general meeting of the Canadian Astronomical Society (CASCA) in Winnipeg, with science sessions (including several prize lectures in astronomy and astronomy education) from May 31–June 2. This year, we are pleased to be able to invite RASC members to attend the conference, at the same conference rate as CASCA members: \$330 (late registration fees will be waived). We are especially honoured to host a public lecture on the evening of June 1 by Dr. Art McDonald from Queen's University, recipient of the 2015 Nobel Prize in Physics.

The entire meeting, including the conference banquet, will take place at the historic Fort Garry Hotel, close to the Forks tourist area and the Canadian Museum for Human Rights.
