
July 29 National Star Party

If the weather is clear, visitors will be able to observe a first quarter Moon and the planets Saturn and Jupiter through telescopes. Even the International Space Station will be visible crossing the night sky.

The events are free and will begin after sunset. We hope that we can make this first National Star Party a success and bring astronomy to thousands of Canadians.
