II. Photo Data Needed

- A. Submit subject data and description of all equipment (instrument, accessories used, etc. for each photo). If terrestrial photos are submitted include a 50mm comparison photo whenever possible.
- B. For all photos please include exposure time (or best guess), film used, any special development or printing techniques.
- C. Include your full name and address (name on each photograph also!). Please include your phone numbers (day and evening) also.

III. Deadline

- A. All photos should be submitted to Celestron International in Torrance, California as soon as possible to the attention of Mr. Kevin Ritschel. The photos must be in our hands by August 31, 1982.
- B. Please pack/ship all materials securely. Do not send slides in glass mounts! Put stiffener material with prints.
- C. Winners will be notified and prizes will be sent out no later than September 30, 1982.

IV. Judging

- A. We are looking for unusual and dramatic photographs. Virtually any subject matter is acceptable. Photos should be of high contrast, very sharp focus, and good color saturation. Subject matter and composition, as well as technical excellence will be considered by the judges.
- B. Four of Celestron's technical staff will judge the photos.

V. Prizes

A. For each category in both B & W and Color, the following awards will be granted:
