Top of mind of course, are the many adaptations the National Office and Centres have made, and are continuing to make, as we collectively adjust to staying safe during the pandemic.

Virtual programming and meetings have been initiated including our first online AGM and GA. Although hosting online Star Parties, webinars and speaker series may not be able to completely replace in-person get togethers, the huge web attendance at various events demonstrates our Society's ongoing commitment to getting together and share our love of space. We have even seen evidence of increased participation in some areas, for example we had record attendance at our AGM this year! General public interest in our field has also grown substantially over this past year as families seeking new hobbies and activities have discovered astronomy. RASC's YouTube posts have had over 20,000 views, extraordinary growth since the spring and creation of new online content. It's too soon to announce 2020 statistics but at the time of this writing, we're incredibly proud to share that more than 600 new members joined this year.

You'll probably have heard that a new member database is in development, scheduled to be operational **early in 2021**. All of us at National are looking forward to the many efficiencies and enhancements offered by the new software and anticipate Centres will also enjoy easier access to member information and various reports. The system will also replace our aging listservs with new communications tools that are much easier to operate, offer users a variety of ways to interact, and are significantly more secure.

Member access to two years of Robotic Telescope data has just been announced on the estore! This allows participants to create beautiful images from the data gathered on comets, galaxies and nebulae. We hope you'll explore and try this new astronomical offering.

Due to property redevelopment, National Office must vacate its location by December 31, 2021. This offers an exciting opportunity to find a facility that will accommodate the Dorner Telescope Museum as well as serve head office requirements. Planning sessions with museum specialists and real estate professionals are scheduled in the new year.
